LWVGTA Forum: BATA Millage Ballot Proposal

Thursday, April 13, 7-8:30pm

Garfield Township Hall, 3848 Veterans Dr.

Representatives from the Bay Area Transportation Authority, the business community, and BATA users will be participating in a League sponsored public forum. BATA's current millage rate is .3447 mills, and the proposal is for .5 mills which will mean a .1553 mill increase. The change would begin January 2018 and last until December 2022. Grand Traverse and Leelanau County residents will vote on this ballot proposal on May 2, 2017.
