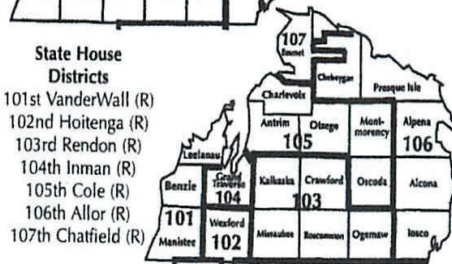
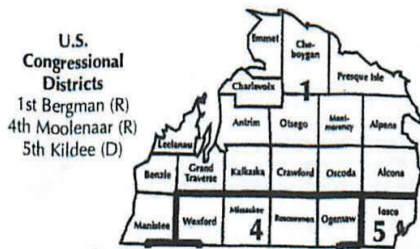

VOTING INFORMATION

You may vote if you are:

- A United States citizen, at least 18 years of age by election day.
- A resident of Michigan and the city or township of which you wish to register for 30 days by election day.
- Registered to vote.

Register to vote at:

- All Secretary of State offices; County, city or township clerk's office in which you wish to vote; Online Voter Registration Application Form.

As a registered voter you may:

- Vote in National, State, County, Local, School and Special Elections. Voting Hours: 7am to 8pm.
- Hold elected and appointed public office.
- Sign legal petitions.
- Become a political party precinct delegate.

Absentee Voter Ballot may be obtained by a registered voter if you are:

- Age 60 or older.
- Unable to vote without assistance to the polls.
- Expecting to be out of town on election day.
- In jail awaiting arraignment or trial.
- Unable to attend the polls due to religious reasons.
- An election worker.

You need to re-register to vote if you have:

- Changed your name.
- Moved.
- Not voted in ten years.
